DAYTON FFA SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION 2023-2024

All information in the application must be completed. All incomplete applications will be removed from consideration. The candidate must be a graduating senior during the spring semester of the year in which the scholarship is awarded. Applicants will be confined to those who will enroll at a public Texas college or university and intend to pursue a degree in an agricultural or agricultural-related field, as specified by the Houston Livestock Show & Rodeo list of major fields of study. The chapter reserves the right to reject any application, which fails to meet these criteria. Scholarship usage may be deferred for a maximum of one year. Selection of the scholarships will be based on financial need, academic performance, leadership, citizenship, and participation in FFA and other community activities. Applications must include an official copy of the applicant's high school transcript, complete with class rank and college entrance scores. Students who have not taken a college entrance exam are not eligible to apply. All applicants must have completed at least six agricultural science courses at the time of graduation, with a minimum of two years or four semesters of courses, and must have been an active FFA member for a minimum of two full years. Funds for the scholarships will be given at two intervals, with one-half being given for the fall semester and one-half being given for the spring semester. Scholarship recipients must present a certified receipt of registration from the college or university signifying that the recipient has enrolled for the semester. The Dayton FFA Chapter may not award an applicant more than two scholarships.

Scholarships to be presented by the chapter, at a minimum of \$200.00, shall include the following: The Brandi Brooks Memorial Scholarship, The Larry Swearingen Memorial Scholarship, The Anson Rigby Memorial Scholarship, and The Marshall Rolke Memorial Scholarship
